Structure and Roles:

The NBDC is a national network of Black disabled leaders, community members, and partners hosted by the Ase Community Foundation. Our lived experiences and historically silenced voices are centred and authentically led by Black people with disabilities—including 100 % of the Executive team and Affinity leads, and 70 % of general members.

All members are invited to participate in the Professional Seminar Series Certificate Program and Special Events. Membership is free.

Executive Committee

Provide strategic and operational leadership and write reports. Work closely with affinity groups, members, and the Ase Community. Hosts Connections & Conversations member meetings.

Affinity Groups Leads & Members

Affinity Leads coordinate and facilitate affinity meetings and membership participation. Affinity group members identify systemic barriers, drive targeted solutions, and report to the Executive Committee. There are 4 Affinity Groups.

Why is this important?

We are not being invited to the tables or networks where decisions, policy, and research are made that affect Black disabled people. There is also a scarcity of disaggregated data and policy, and limited Black culturally affirming, accessible programs.

Black disabled people experience higher rates of poverty, unemployment, underemployment, and health inequalities; with youth, women, and sole support parents experiencing significantly higher rates of poverty, and lower rates of access to federal benefits and credits.




