POSITION SUMMARY

The Youth Coordinator will be responsible for coordinating the Ase Community's youth strategic priority, including planning the annual Black Student Success Summit, implementing the Ase Youth Coalition, school year events, consolidating resources, and developing partnerships with key organizations focused on youth, particularly Black youth with disabilities.

Key Responsibilities

- Coordinate and execute key youth events (eg. Black Student Success Summit, orientation prep for new post-secondary students with disabilities)
- Coordinate the youth and their activities during the summer job program
- Develop programming for new post-secondary students with disabilities
- Coordinate, expand, and execute the Student Caucus of Black and disability student groups
- Assist in the development of the Youth Strategy, including the extension of initiatives to include high school and college youth
- Develop accessibility training and resource documents for student groups
- Continue the relationship with student groups
- Write reports on the youth-based activities of the ASE Community
- Consolidate a list of Black student conferences and collaborative events (eg. Black graduations,

- Proven ability to engage with community members and build relationships within the Black community and/or the disability community, particularly youth
- Demonstrated ability to work independently and effectively allocate your time to complete important productive tasks

- Experience working and/or volunteering in a non-profit organization
- Experience working within Black/disability organizations/groups is an asset
- Proficient with Microsoft Office suite and/or G-Suite
- Passionate about dismantling anti-Black racism and ableism
- Team player who will contribute to a collaborative team environment

- Be between 15 and 30 years of age at the beginning of the employment period
- Be a Canadian citizen, permanent resident, or person to whom refugee protection has been conferred under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act for the duration of the employment
- Have a valid Social Insurance Number at the start of employment and be legally entitled to work in Canada in accordance with relevant provincial or territorial legislation and regulations.
